tiful way. I hope you noticed it as well. Secondly, we needed recently to replace the flagpole outside of St. Peter Church. About a year ago, just as discussions were beginning to take place about the need to replace it, I received a call asking about the McKinley Flagpole at St. Peter Church. I had never heard that the flagpole at St. Peter used to be on the property of the President McKinley Home, which was directly behind St. Peter Church. After confirming with some of our parishioners, we were able to determine that the eagle that rests on top of the flagpole is the only part that is from that historical flagpole. Therefore, we continued with the plan to replace the flagpole itself, and the eagle is being restored to be placed back on top. I look forward to seeing the McKinley Eagle returned in all its glory!

There will be no daily Masses this week, as I will be traveling with my family to Florida for a few days of vacation. I will be returning in time for the weekend Masses, so I will see you again next week!


