Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Since 2013, St. Peter School has been led by the guidance of our principal, Mrs. Sandie Fusillo. She adeptly led the school through the transition from a Pre-K-8 School to a Pre-K-5 School, along with the schools in Eastern Stark County, moving 6-8th grades to St. Thomas Aquinas. Additionally, she worked to open our school to students from neighboring parishes and from the city of Canton who desired access to better education and opportunity. She learned the dynamics of the application process of the EdChoice Ohio Voucher Program, and helped many families to access the funds that afforded them a Catholic Education. After a sharp decline in enrollment because the upper grades were lost, Mrs. Fusillo worked to stabilize enrollment, and eventually to grow St. Peter School. My first year as Pastor, I was proud to report that our school was the fastest growing school in the diocese. Now, our enrollment is stable and strong. During this past year, Mrs. Fusillo guided our teachers and students through the difficult decisions of 2020, and has worked hard all summer to prepare our school building and our students to return safely to school at the end of this month. Unfortunately, she will not be there to lead us this year, as she has made the difficult choice to retire. We thank Mrs. Fusillo for her dedicated service to our parish and school, and as she transitions into retirement in the coming weeks, we assure her of our love and support and prayers. God bless you and be with you in this next chapter of your life. You always have a place in our hearts, and in the halls of St. Peter.

We will welcome as our new principal, Mr. John Airhart. Mr. Airhart will come to us from Florida, where he has been serving as a guidance counselor, but he is a native of Stark County. He had served as principal for a number of years in the West Branch Schools in western Mahoning County, and later as the principal of St. James in Waynesburg. He comes to us highly recommended, and is ready to walk with us through the next phase

of Covid-19, and into a strong future for St. Peter School. Mr. Airhart is not a stranger to St. Peter School, for his own children were sent here. So, he is very familiar with the St. Peter Family, and looks forward once again to being a St. Peter Hornet! As we celebrate our 160th Anniversary, we enter new challenges, and we look forward to the ways that Mr. Airhart will lead us through them. We assure him of our prayers as he moves back to Ohio and begins his work at our school.

As I mentioned after Mass last Sunday, three new priests for the Diocese of Youngstown were ordained this Saturday morning: Fr. Matthew Humerickhouse, Fr. Ryan Furlong, and Fr. Matthew Zwilling. May God bless them as they begin their priestly life and ministry in the diocese. Next month, on Saturday, September 12, we will celebrate the ordination of two transitional deacons (who will then be ordained as priests next summer, with the help of God): Chad Johnson, a son of St. Peter Church, and Brian Smith, who spent a year with us for his pastoral internship. We assure all these men of our prayers and support in these days. Chad will preach his first homily as a deacon of the Church at the 10:30 AM Mass on Sunday, September 13, after which we hope to have a reception with social distancing measures in place in the St. Peter Social Hall. So that we might properly prepare, if you plan to attend the reception, please RSVP to our Parish Activities Coordinator, Pamela Pope, 330-454-8044 x 404.

Finally, congratulations to Landry Sutton Hoffner and to her parents and godparents on the occasion of her baptism this weekend at St. Peter Church. May God, who begins his good work in you today, bring it to fulfillment.
