**A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles**

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with the them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.”

When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

## Intentions of Pope Francis

### **For Deacons**

We pray that deacons, faithful in their service to the Word and the poor, may be an invigorating symbol for the entire Church.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The Feast of the Ascension, whose celebration has been transferred for the past 25 years from the 40th Day (Thursday) to this 7th Sunday of Easter, reminds us of an important reality: Our Blessed Lord has gone before us into Heaven to prepare a place for us. Jesus Christ, who came to earth as one of us, and united Himself perfectly to our humanity, has returned, by His own power, to the glory of Heaven. And, in doing so, He has taken our humanity into Heaven. Therefore, What Jesus is currently experiencing—that is, the unification of Body and Soul in Heaven—is what we hope also to experience at the end of time, after Christ comes again in glory. What we celebrate today, therefore, we hope for ourselves to receive. Following the example given by Jesus Christ on earth, and with the help of God's grace, we pray that we might come to experience that same Glory in Heaven. Let us live always with this in mind, and pray continually to have a share in the Life of God.

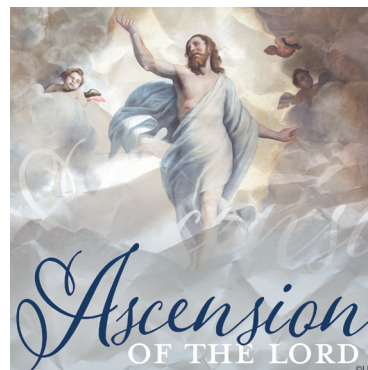
Next Sunday, as we celebrate Pentecost, we will return for the first public Sunday Masses. I am hoping that we are able to avoid the chaos that some are anticipating, like the Apostles who all began speaking different languages on Pentecost. It is important to follow all the guidelines, which you should have (or will soon) receive in the mail. Also, please check our parish websites and facebook pages for a video from me, walking through the changes. The most important thing to remember is that, no matter what precautions you take, you cannot control what others are doing. So, any time you gather together with others, even at Mass, you are putting yourself at risk. To that end, Bishop Murry has extended the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. If you do not feel comfortable, you can rest assured that you have permission to remain at home. Furthermore, we are asking people to think about others: if you are sick, DO NOT COME TO CHURCH. Please take your temperature before com-

ing, and if you have a fever, please DO NOT COME TO CHURCH. Wash your hands regularly with soap and water. Everyone should maintain social distancing in Church: only one household per pew, even if that means there is only one person in a pew; no hand shaking; wear a mask before and after Mass as you come into the Church and exit; wear a mask throughout Mass, as much as possible (except to sing and receive Holy Communion). If we are all taking the necessary precautions, we are going to help each other to stay safe and healthy. Please do not force me to begin policing the situation before and after Mass. I know that there will be excitement to see each other and to return to the reception of the Sacraments, but we must do so in a prayerful, reverent, respectful, and safe manner. Please be patient. Finally, if you believe that the Sunday Mass crowd will be too large, but are still wanting to come back to Mass, consider attending a daily Mass instead. These will begin this Tuesday, May 26 (Tuesday and Thursday at 7:30 AM at the Basilica; Wednesday and Friday at 7:30 AM at St. Peter).

Finally, our sympathies and prayers are with the families and friends of Betty Rufo of the Basilica of Saint John the Baptist and Myron Pandrea, formerly of St. Peter Church, who passed away this past week. May God grant them eternal rest, as He provides comfort and consolation to those who mourn their passing.
